There are toilets and sinks that I can use whenever I need to.







I will be able to play outside with the other children.

If you have any questions, or any worries that you would like to discuss, your first port of call is always your child's class teacher. You can call the school office on 01858 462528, and the office will arrange for your child's teacher to call you back, when they are available.

A member of the Inclusion Team may then contact you to discuss doing additional work with your child, to support them. More details about the Inclusion Team are provided at the end of this booklet.

## Meet the Inclusion Team...

The school's Inclusion Team provides support for all children with a special educational need or a disability (SEND). The team also supports the children's wellbeing and provides pastoral support for a number of children. Sometimes this support is short-term, for a few weeks, and sometimes children need longer-term help.



Mrs Kaur (Assistant Head for Inclusion and Special Education Needs and Disabilities Coordinator) leads the Inclusion Team. This includes leading on SEND issues and all pastoral support for our children.

Mrs Carter (Emotional Literacy Support Assistant and Forest School Lead) supports children with pastoral needs. For example, she works with children who need some help to understand and regulate their emotions. Mrs Carter also runs our Forest School.





Mrs Jepson (Family Liaison Adviser) is here to help families. She provides parenting advice, can offer support during difficult family situations, and can help to signpost to other organisations who help local families, such as the Food Bank or health and counselling services.

Mrs Thomas-Frederick (usually known as Mrs T-F, Emotional Literacy Support Assistant) works closely with a number of children to help them with emotional difficulties, including anger management, self-regulation and anxiety.



Mrs Turner (SEND Support) provides admin support to the team, and can help with SEND-related documents and assessments, and applications for funding. Mrs Turner also works in the main school office on Mondays and Tuesdays.
