
Weekly Attendance

Class Updates

EYFS

Over the last 2 weeks, EYFS have been very busy, finishing their work around the story of Jack and the Beanstalk. They have really enjoyed acting out the story, writing about it and we have planted beans and been watering them carefully. We have moved around our outside area and now have a larger outdoor art area, which was ideal for our work for the carnival float. Den building, the mud kitchen and our new water tray and resources have also been very popular! We are now working on the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar and are excitedly observing our caterpillars daily, so we can learn about the lifecycle of a butterfly. In Maths, we have revised work on number bonds to 5 and 10, as well as our understanding of numbers to 10, including odd and even numbers and double facts. A real highlight was when the new intake came for their 'Stay and Play' sessions, we got to work in the Year One classrooms as they were out on a trip. We are feeling very 'grown up' and ready for our transition to Year One!

Year 1

This week the year ones have completed their national phonics screening assessment; the year 1 team are very proud of all their hard work and trying their very best during the test. Next week we will be continuing to learn about homes – past and present. In maths, we will be starting a new topic on "time".

Year 2

Year 2 had a wonderful time at East Carlton Park where we enjoyed learning about habitats and survival techniques in the wild. We have all furthered our understanding of left and right when

learning about position in maths and also mapping our routes in geography. Next week we are looking forward to Sports Day!

Year 3

Next week in year 3, we will be having our end of the year English and Maths assessments. Along with this we will be having our single word spelling and reading tests. In science we are going to be learning about what the functions of the different parts of a flowering plant.

Year 4

Year 4 have completed the Times Tables check on line. Phew! We have also been busy learning about how Alfred the Great saved England from a Viking invasion. We have also started a new Geography topic called the shape of the land. We are learning about mountains. In particular we are focussing in on Mount Everest. We are also getting ready for Sports Day next Thursday. See you there.

Year 5

The Year 5's have been busy getting ready for their transition into Year 6. As a consequence, we have been re-visiting as well as practising some of our character champions skills such as teamwork, resilience and self-efficacy. In P.E. we have done yoga balance poses in small groups, so that we can all learn to be calm and composed. In science we have talked as a whole year group about puberty in a respectful and sensitive way. Finally, in geography we have considered the deforestation of rainforests and the need to speak out in order to preserve our vital biodiverse environments.

Year 6

This week has been our second week at forest school where the children have loved exploring the outside area, using their imaginations and teamwork skills to make lasting memories of their time together. In the classroom, we have been focussing on our last writing unit at Little Bowden, using our narrative writing skills to entertain our readers. In Maths, we have been learning about how maths can help us in our futures, investigating salaries, making links with how as adults we will budget to pay for important items such as mortgages and bills, not forgetting the fun things that we enjoy too (yes, we made sure there was a monthly budget for ice-cream!). In PE we have been practising for sports day next week, and we have also been practising for our end of year production. Next week we will be focussing on practising our performance, including using the props and our costumes.
