Attendance Update

Further to the new Government Guidelines relating to the issue of Penalty Notices coming in, please find an information leaflet advising you of the changes that will be **coming into force on 19th August**.

5 Consecutive Days of Term Time Leave. Penalty Notice fines will be issued for term time leave of 5 or more consecutive days, and for fewer days where this has happened before. 10 Sessions of Unauthorised Absence in a 10-week period. Penalty Notice fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions of absence in a 10-week period

Per Parent, Per Child Penalty Notice fines will be issued to each parent, for each child who was absent. For example: 3 siblings absent for term time leave will result in each parent receiving 3 separate fines.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child when paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or irregular attendance the amount will be: £160 per parent, per child when paid within 28 days. (No option to pay at £80 level)

Third offence and Any Further Offences (within 3 years)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time Leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued. The case will proceed to the Magistrates' court. Magistrate's fines can be up to £2,500 per parent, per child

Class Updates

EYFS

This week the children watched in awe as the butterfly emerged from the chrysalis. The children have been doing observational drawings of butterflies and labelling them using their phonic knowledge. In maths, the children went on a shape hunt around the school. They have been revisiting 2D shape names and their properties. The children have also been learning how to carry a tray at dinner time, so that they are ready for year one!

Year 1

Year One enjoyed meeting their new teachers this week. They spent the day in their new classrooms and all came back saying they'd had a great day! In maths this week, we have finished off our work on money and started learning about position and direction.

Year 2

Year 2 have enjoyed creating box cars in Design and Technology, consolidating maths through fun practical activities, meeting their new teachers for the transition day (they all did really well), daily 'read to me' time exploring new vocabulary and comprehension and the many times in the hall this week (especially for the exciting end-of-year gold awards and headteacher award!)

Year 2 had a wonderful time visiting their new classes on Tuesday and now can't wait to become grown up Year 3's! We have really enjoyed looking back over some of the work we have done this year and will be gradually sending books home over the next few days.

Year 3

In our English lessons we have written and published our own poem using Jim - a Cautionary Tale by Hilaire Belloc as our inspiration. We have also written a letter to our new teachers so that they can get to know us a little more before next year. In maths we have continued our statistics unit and learnt how to draw and interpret pictograms and also draw and interpret bar charts. In our science lesson we have observed different plants and learnt about how they have adapted to survive in different environments.

Year 4

Year 4 have been very excited about meeting their new teachers. They had a great transition day. They have also had a fun day at Twin Lakes. What a great way to end the year. The Year 4 team would like to wish everyone a great holiday and a big thank you and goodbye from Mr and Mrs Smithies.

Year 5

This week the Year 5's have been busy completing the rest of their summer term tests. Somehow the teachers have also managed to squeeze in some yoga lessons in P.E, coding in computers, volume in maths as well as desert climates in geography. Summer Reading Challenge

The start of this year's Summer Reading Challenge is on **Saturday 6th July!**

This year's Summer Reading Challenge is about getting CREATIVE. Music, junk-modelling, photography, dancing, story-writing...the possibilities are endless. The Summer Reading Challenge is led by The Reading Agency, and supported by 90% of UK Libraries. The Challenge is for children aged 4-12 (although there is a mini Under-4s Challenge too!). Join the Marvellous Makers in Leicestershire Libraries from 6 July to 7 September.

The theme will be **Marvellous Makers** which is about taking part, reading for fun and expressing your creativity.
